

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Where was MY God?

How many of us have heard that question "Where was your GOD when the World Trade Center and the Pentagon was attacked?"

Well I know where my GOD was the morning of September 11, 2001, and He was very busy!



He was trying to discourage anyone from taking these flights. Those four flights together held over 1000 passengers and there were only 266 aboard.

He was on 4 commercial flights giving terrified passengers the ability to stay calm. Not one of the family members who were called by a loved one on one of the highjacked planes said that passengers were screaming in the background. On one of the flights he was giving strength to passengers to try to overtake the highjackers.

He was busy trying to create obstacles for employees at the World Trade Center. After all, only around 20,000 were at the towers when the

first jet hit. Since the buildings held over 50,000

workers, this was a Miracle in itself. How many of the people who were employed at the World Trade Center told the media that they were late for work or they had traffic delays.

He was holding up 2-110 story buildings so that 2/3 of the workers could get out. I was so amazed that the top of the towers didn't topple when the jets impacted. And when they did fall, they fell inward. GOD didn't allow them to topple over, as many more lives would have been lost.

And when the buildings went down, my GOD picked up almost 6,000 of his children and carried them home with him. Reassuring his frighten children that the worst was over and the best was yet to come.

He sat down and cried that 19 of his children could have some much hate in their hearts. That they didn't choose him, but another god that doesn't exist, and now they are lost forever.

He sent his children that are best trained for this disaster and had them save the few that were still alive, but unable to help themselves. And then sent many others to help in anyway they were needed.

He still isn't finished though, he held the loved ones that were left behind in his arms. He comforts them daily. His other children are given the strength to reach out to them and help them in any way they can.

And I believe he will continue to help us in what is to come. He will give the people in charge of this great nation the strength and the wisdom to do the right thing. He would never leave us in our time of need.

So when anyone asks, "Where was your GOD on September 11", you can say "everywhere"! And yes, although this is without a doubt the worst thing I have seen in my life, I see God's miracles in every bit of it. I keep praying for those who don't believe in GOD, every chance I have. I can't imagine going through such a difficult time and not believing in GOD. Life would be hopeless.

Beheading of St. John - Human Respect



The chief lesson we should learn from the Beheading of St. John the Baptist is the importance of avoiding what is called "human respect". This expression does not mean the respect that all men and women ought to have for one another: every human being is created by God and loved by God and deserves respect; if we wish others to respect ourselves, we in turn must respect others.

However, the term "human respect" means the fault of being more concerned about our standing in the eyes of other people than we are concerned about our standing in the yes of God. This was the basic sin of King Herod, which led him to murder St. John the Baptist. King Herod knew very well

that St John was an upright and holy man; King Herod even loved to listen to St. John, and often followed St. John's advice.

Even though most of us do not go around murdering other people (though there are a great many killings in modern times with motives similar to that of Herod), we are often tempted by the same sin of "human respect" - to do something which we know to be morally wrong, only because we fear that others may mock or ridicule us, or even discriminate against us if they think that we are adhering to a Christian moral standard. "Human respect" is a very powerful temptation; we must pray that God will give us the strength and the moral courage to ignore "human respect" and to do what we know is right.

God won't ask how many friends you had, but will ask how many people to whom you were a true friend.

very husband and wife enter their married lives with great expectations. Sometimes, however, hopes and dreams for a long and prosperous life together are dashed by some unforeseen tragedy. Such was the case for the HOLY MARTYR ADRIAN and NATALIA, his beloved wife.

The saintly couple were both born into wealthy families. Their marriage was to last for only a little over a year. Tradition has it that the wicked Emperor Maximian visited their home town of Nicomedia, determined to seek out every Christian in the village and put them to death. 23 Christians were found hiding in a cave and were taken before the local magistrate.

Adrian, who was not yet a Christian (Natalia secretly was), questioned these faithful followers about their motivation for their willingness to suffer for Christ. He was so impressed with their sincerity that he boldly proclaimed before the Emperor: "I AM A CHRISTIAN AS WELL." Natalia then ministered to her husband and fellow Christians while they were in prison. Adrian finally succumbed to the severe tortures inflicted upon him. His grieving wife was permitted to take his remains to Constantinople for burial.

While in Constantinople, Natalia had a vision of her husband Adrian, who appeared to her bathed in light. He assured her that God would soon be calling her home as well and that they would then be together in the Kingdom of Heaven. A few days later, Natalia peacefully fell asleep in the Lord, commending her soul into His Divine Hands.

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
